
OPUBCO's First Century

This book is well documented and researched, lots of great photos, and good details about OPUBCO founder E.K. Gaylord. But if you're looking for a full history, this book is a disappointment. I suggest pairing this book up with "Me and My Big Mouth" by Walter Harrison, and you'll get closer to learning more about the OPUBCO empire and the Gaylord dynasty.
